Sub: Additional restrictions regarding COVID-19 applicable w.e.f. 02.05.2021 to 15.05.2021.


1. In continuation to this office letter No. 7/56/2020/2H4/2142 dated the 30th April 2021 in the subject matter which shall continue to be enforced till 15.05.2021.
2. In addition to the restrictions as imposed vide letter referred to hereinabove, the following additional restrictions shall be strictly and meticulously enforced:-

- i. All shops selling non-essential items to remain closed

Essential items include Chemist shops and shops dealing with supply of essential goods, milk, bread, vegetables, fruits, dairy and poultry products like eggs, meat, mobile repair etc.

No restriction on laboratories, nursing homes and all other medical establishments.

- ii. Nobody to enter the State whether by air, rail or road without either
 - a. Negative Covid report not more than 72 hours old, or
 - b. Vaccination certificate (at least one dose) over 2 weeks old.



- iii. All Government offices as well as banks will work at 50% strength other than those where officials are involved in Covid management. Deputy Commissioners are authorised to draft services of any official for Covid management and related duties.
- iv. All Four-Wheeler Passenger vehicles, including Cars and taxis, not allowed to seat more than 2 passengers. Vehicles carrying patients to hospitals exempted. No Pillion riders on scooters and motorcycles except those belonging to the same family and living in the same house.
- v. No gathering of more than 10 persons to be allowed; including for weddings/cremations/funerals.
- vi. Villages will organise Thikri Pehras to ensure that 'Night Curfew' and 'Weekend Curfew' Orders are complied with.
- vii. Social Distancing to be maintained in Sabzi Mandis, which would be open only to Fruit and Vegetable Wholesalers.
- viii. Appeals to Kisan Unions and Religious leaders not to hold gatherings and restrict number of protestors to token presence at Toll Plazas, Petrol Pumps, Malls etc.
- ix. Religious Places to be closed at 6 pm daily. No overcrowding at Gurudwaras, Mandirs, Masjids, Churches etc.
- x. Action by District Administrations against those hoarding Oxygen Cylinders etc.
- xi. RT-PCR testing of Road and Streetwise vendors, such as Rehriwallahs etc. to be carried out.



3. Implementation to be stepped up

- i. Daily Night Curfew from 6 pm to 5 am and Weekend curfew from 6.00 pm on Friday upto 5.00 am on Monday throughout the state. No vehicle to ply except for medical purposes. with curfew pass
- ii. Number in public transport (buses, taxis, autos) to be restricted to 50% of the capacity. Transport and civil officials, along with police personnel, to constitute flying squads to enforce.
- iii. All bars, cinema halls, Gyms, spas, swimming pools, coaching centres, sports complexes to remain closed.
- iv. All restaurants (including in hotels), Cafes, Coffee Shops, fast food outlets, Dhabas etc. to remain closed for dine-in and may function only for take-away. Home delivery allowed till 9pm. No seating inside Restaurants, Fast Food Joint, Coffee Shops etc. to be allowed.
- v. All Weekly markets (such as apnimandis) to be closed.
- vi. There shall be a complete ban on all social, cultural or sports gatherings and related functions, including government functions, such as inaugurations, foundation stone laying ceremonies, etc unless prior permission of Deputy Commissioner has been obtained.
- vii. There shall be a complete ban across the State on all political gatherings. For any gathering organised in violation of these orders, FIRs will be registered against the organisers and participants as well as against the owners of the venue and the tent houses under the Disaster Management Act and the Epidemic Diseases Act. Such venues shall also be sealed for next 3 months.
- viii. Persons who have attended large gatherings anywhere (religious/political/social) to be mandatorily home quarantined for 5 days and tested as per protocol.
- ix. All educational institutions i.e. schools and colleges to remain closed but the teaching and non-teaching staff of Govt schools to attend duty.
- x. All the medical and nursing colleges may continue to remain open.
- xi. All recruitment exams to be postponed, unless it relates to recruitment of Covid management related manpower.



- xii. All Private Offices, including Service Industry, such as offices of Architects, Chartered Accountants, Insurance Companies etc., allowed to 'Work from Home' only.
- xiii. In Government offices – Health/ frontline workers and employees over 45 years who have not got at least one vaccine dose in last 15 days or more, should be encouraged to take leave and stay home until then. Employees under 45 years to be allowed only on basis of negative RT-PCR not more than 5 days old or else should take leave and stay home.
- xiv. Micro-containment zones in high positivity areas to be increased and strictly enforced. Special Monitors to be designated for enforcement.
- xv. Grievance redressal by all the government offices shall be preferred through virtual/on-line modes. Public dealings be discouraged as far as possible and allowed only where deemed unavoidable. Revenue Department shall also endeavour to limit appointments to public to bare minimum for execution of Conveyance Deeds for sale and purchase of properties.

4. District authorities shall also continue to ensure strict implementation of all the extant directives of MHA/State Government on Covid appropriate behaviour including social distancing norm of minimum 6 feet distance (Do Gaz Ki Doori), regulating crowds in market places and public transport, and imposition of penalties prescribed for violation of Covid appropriate behaviour like wearing of face masks and spitting in public places etc.



1. Person who have attended large gathering anywhere (religious/political/social) should be mandatorily home quarantined for 5 days and tested as per protocol.

2. In Government and Private offices-Health/frontline workers and employee over 45 days years who have not received at least one dose of Covid vaccine in last 15 days or more, should be encouraged to take leave and stay home until they receive vaccine. Employees under 45 years to be allowed only on basis of negative RT-PCR not more than 5 old or else should take leave and stay home.

3. Testing booths (RAT testing) to be set up at bus stands and railway stations, Airport; all persons arriving into the State must carry negative RT-PCR report of not more than 72 hours old, else undergo mandatory RAT testing at the bus stands, Airport and railway stations.

4. Micro-containment zones in high positivity areas should be increased and strictly enforced. Special monitors are to be designated for enforcement.

5. All private hospital providing critical Covid care must immediately reserve 75% of their L-3 beds for Covid.

6. Elective surgeries stand postponed in all Government or Private Hospitals providing Covid care service till May 15, 2021.

7. All Private and Government hospitals must test all OPD patients and encourage vaccination of eligible persons.

Subject: Revised instructions for International and domestic travelers coming into Punjab by all means of Transport i.e. Air, Rail and by Road.

I. Guidelines for International Travelers:

1. All international travelers arriving in Punjab through Air/Road travel will submit self declaration with personal and health details at www.newdelhiairport.in and hand over a copy of the same to State officers. They would be screened as per the health protocol at the port of entry. All foreign travelers entering state shall fill in Annexure-I and submit to District Health/Administration Authorities.

2. Travelers who will submit a negative RT-PCR test report (conducted within 96 hrs prior to undertaking the journey) before arrival on the portal and produce a copy of same on arrival will be allowed home quarantine. They will also be asked to submit a written undertaking to health officials/district administration for self-monitoring of their health status and would download COVA app and keep it active. In case, any symptoms develop they shall inform the district surveillance officer or district administration. They will get tested for COVID-19 on 5th day of arrival by RTPCR as per protocol. When reports come and if they test negative, home quarantine ends. They will self monitor their health for next 7 days and report if any symptoms develop.

3. Travelers who do not submit a negative RT-PCR test report on arrival shall be tested by Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) Kits.

a) If Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) comes positive for Covid-19 she/he may opt for Home isolation /Government Isolation Facility or Private Facility on payment basis and will be treated as per COVID-19 management protocol. Person opting for home isolation will submit a consent form stating that he/she has a facility for home isolation at his/her residence, is asymptomatic/mild-symptomatic and not have any co morbidity or the comorbid condition is under control. Person will strictly follow home isolation protocol.

b) If Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) comes negative for Covid-19 he/she will be allowed home quarantine. The person will get tested for COVID-19 by RT-PCR on the 5th day after arrival. When RT-PCR for COVID -19 is found to be negative,

home quarantine ends. They will self monitor their health for next 7 days and report if any symptoms develop.

- c) If RT-PCR for COVID -19 is found to be positive, they shall be assessed clinically and follow the Punjab COVID -19 management protocol.

4. They will follow all precautionary measures issued by Govt. of Punjab for prevention of COVID -19 spread such as hand hygiene, wearing mask, and maintain social distancing etc.

II. Guidelines for domestic travel (air/train/inter-state travel by road):

1. All persons arriving through air, rail, and road will be screened for symptoms of COVID-19.
2. Symptomatic persons will be tested and as per their test reports, protocols of Health Department will be followed
3. Asymptomatic will be home quarantined and if they remain asymptomatic for 5 days, home quarantine ends.
4. They will self monitor their health and if any symptoms appear, report immediately
5. If they develop any symptoms, shall be tested and as per their test report, protocol of Health Department shall be followed.
6. The passengers entering and leaving the state within 72 hours of entry into the state shall be exempted from above protocol.
7. Frequent travelers entering and leaving state for professional or commercial requirements would be exempted from above protocol.
8. All persons entering state will download COVA app and keep it active. In case, any symptoms develop they shall inform the district surveillance officer or district administration

4. I undertake that I will get myself tested on day 5 of home quarantine and submit my report to district authorities.
5. During this period I shall monitor my health and those around me and interact with the assigned surveillance teams. In case I develop symptoms or any Medical condition consistent with COVID-19, I will immediately inform 104/district control room.
6. That presently I am asymptomatic/mildly symptomatic.
7. I don't have any co morbid conditions/have co morbidity-Hypertension/Diabetes/Kidney disease/lung disease/heart disease/any other and the co morbid condition is under control.
8. I have facilities for home quarantine as per the guidelines and the same can be verified by the officials for confirmation.
9. I have been explained in detail about the precautions that I need to follow while I am under home quarantine.
10. I have active COVA app (https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=in.gov.punjab.cova&hl=en_IN) on my phone and I assure that it will remain active throughout the period of isolation (through Bluetooth and WiFi).
11. I am liable to be acted on under section 188 of IPC as per provision of "The Epidemic Diseases Act 1897" for any non-adherence to self-isolation protocol.

ORDER

1. Whereas, in exercise of powers under the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, the Government of Punjab has already issued the Punjab Epidemic Disease, COVID-19 Regulations, 2020 for the containment and prevention of the spread of COVID-19.
2. Whereas latest guidelines have been received from the Govt. of Punjab, Department of Home Affairs and Justice, Chandigarh vide no. 55/ACSH/2020/478 dated 12.6.2020.
3. Whereas it is imperative to put in strict measures of isolation and social distancing to contain the spread of COVID-19 in the district.
4. Whereas, in continuation of the orders issued by the undersigned vide order no. 1879-1909 dated 07.6.2020 and in exercise of powers conferred under the Rule 12 of the Punjab Epidemic Disease, COVID-19 Regulations, 2020, and section 144 of Cr. P.C., 1973, I, Shivdular Singh Dhillon, IAS, District Magistrate, Amritsar, hereby issue this order applicable in the territorial jurisdiction of Amritsar district:-

The following restrictions shall be in place:-

1. All shops/shopping malls/stand-alone shops other than those mentioned in paragraph below shall remain closed on Sunday. On Saturday and other gazetted holidays, concerned SDMs/DCPs are authorized to regulate the opening of shops/market complexes or stagger their timings as the situation warrants in their respective areas of jurisdiction.
2. Shops dealing with essential commodities/services will continue to be allowed to open till 7.00 PM on all days. Restaurants (for take home/home delivery only) will continue to be open till 8.00 P.M. on all days.
3. Liquor shops will continue to be open till 8.00 P.M. on all days.
4. There will be restriction on the inter-district/intra-district movement of citizens on Saturday, Sunday and other gazetted holidays. On these days, inter-district/intra-district movement allowed shall be against e-pass which will be issued only for essential work.
5. Marriage functions upto 50 persons will be permitted against e-pass which will be issued for upto 50 specific persons on all days.

These restrictions will not be applicable to people & establishments dealing with:-

1. Essential services i.e. Food, Groceries, vegetables, fruits, Milk, Medicines etc.
2. Petrol pumps are allowed to open on all days.
3. Industries and Industrial establishments:
All categories of Industries are allowed to operate in both rural and urban areas. There will be no restriction on movement of persons working in these industries. Their I-cards will serve as valid permit for movement.
4. Construction Activities:
All legal construction activities are allowed without any restriction in both urban and rural areas.



5. All services related to agricultural, horticultural, animal husbandry and veterinary services are allowed without any restriction.
6. In case of medical emergency, no pass shall be required.
7. For passengers coming by Air/Rail, boarding pass/ticket will be considered as valid movement pass on weekends and public holidays

These orders shall take immediate effect and will be applicable till further orders.

NOTE:- All Scheduled examinations for which permissions have been granted will be held as per schedule.

1. Frequent interstate travelers who need to move outside Punjab regarding their profession such as salespersons, transporters, doctors, journalists, executives moving for business, engineers, traders, consultants etc will not be Home quarantined as is done in the protocol issued for persons coming to Punjab from other States.
2. Deputy Commissioners and Sub-Divisional Magistrate will issue passes to such persons who shall submit an undertaking for self monitoring of their health and will inform the administration in case they experience any symptoms (Fever, dry cough, difficulty in breathing) of COVID-19.

Sub: Resumption of Domestic Flights at Adampur Airport.

As Flights Operations is going to be resumed from Adampur Airport from 25.05.2020, so as per Guidelines of Central and State Govts. regarding the International and Domestic passengers ensure the compliance of the following instructions:-

1. **For Domestic passengers:** In respect of domestic passengers arriving from other states, all passengers shall have to be home quarantined for 14 days as per guidelines issued by Punjab Govt. letter no. COVID-19/4HB4/2020/91-92 dated- 07.05.2020 and the other instructions issued by Centre & State Govt. from time to time.
2. **For International passengers:** For all the international passengers arriving through connected flight shall have to undergo compulsory hotel/community quarantine of minimum 14 days as per SOP and guidelines issued by Punjab Govt. vide letter no. SCCR/2020/267 dated- 08.05.2020, letter no. 14/7/20-4HB4 PF/1269-73 dated- 19.05.2020 & letter no. DSP/NHM/Pb/20/5482-5503 dated- 23.05.2020 and further compliance of instructions issued under the SOP & the other instructions issued by Centre & State Govt. from time to time.
3. **Civil Surgeon, Jalandhar** will depute a medical team to screen all the incoming passengers and take necessary action as per Punjab Govt. Guidelines.
4. **SSP (Rural), Jalandhar** is directed to make necessary security arrangements.
5. **Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar, SSP, Rural, Jalandhar & Civil Surgeon, Jalandhar** will ensure the proper quarantine of the passengers.



ORDER

1. WHEREAS, COVID19 has already been declared as a pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO) and National Disaster Management Authority, being satisfied that the country is threatened with the COVID19 epidemic, has extended the lockdown in the entire country.
2. WHEREAS, as per directions of MHA, air travel shall resume from 25.05.2020 and as Chandigarh International Airport (CHIAL) falls in the jurisdiction of the district the entry of inbound persons into the State needs to be regulated in line with the protocol of the Health Department of the State of Punjab for the containment and prevention of the spread of COVID19.
3. WHEREAS, guidelines have been issued today by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India for domestic travel which specifically mention in that "States can also develop their own protocol with regard to quarantine and isolation as per their assessment."
4. WHEREAS, as per the instructions received from the Government of Punjab, the following shall be ensured:
 - i. The Airlines shall publicize this information extensively so as to ensure that this information is made available to all the passengers boarding the flights well before they reach the airports i.e. the points of departure.
 - ii. The Station Managers of the respective Airlines shall make available to the Nodal Officer – lists of passengers in the flight whose destination is Punjab, well in advance.
 - iii. All passengers belonging to Punjab shall be tested for COVID19 at the airport. Civil Surgeon, Mohali shall depute adequate teams at the airport for this purpose. The Nodal Officer shall ensure that their names, mobile numbers and addresses are duly noted.
 - iv. All such persons shall be required to undergo mandatory Home Quarantine for a period of 14 days from the date of arrival. In case the test comes out to be positive, the person/s shall be shifted to an isolation facility. In case the test comes out to be negative, the person shall still be required to undergo home quarantine for 14 days and shall self-monitor their health status and report to the nearest government health facility in case they develop any COVID19 symptoms.
 - v. The Nodal Officer shall ensure that the names, addresses and mobile numbers of all other arriving passengers (not belonging to Punjab) are duly recorded and passed on to respective DCs for further necessary action as per the protocol of the recipient state.
 - vi. It is clarified that mandatory COVID19 tests shall be done only of passengers whose destination is Punjab (any district). The passengers for UT of Chandigarh, Haryana, HP etc. moving through the airport shall be dealt with as per the protocol of the recipient State.
6. All the concerned authorities shall ensure the strict compliance of these instructions.

Subject: Revised instructions for people coming into Punjab (international as well as Domestic) by all means of Transport i.e. Air, Rail and by Road.

In supersession of earlier guidelines issued on the aforementioned subject matter.

1. Guidelines for International Travelers:

- (i) All persons arriving to Punjab state through Airport/seaport/land port will handover self declaration form having personal and health details to State officers. They would be screened as per the health protocol at the port of entry.
- (ii) The passengers found to be symptomatic during screening shall be taken to health facility for testing. If found positive they would be treated as per health protocol (as mentioned in para 4 below).
- (iii) Asymptomatic passengers and those found negative (para-ii above) will be taken into Institutional quarantine (Govt/hotel quarantine) on payment basis and will be tested on the 5th day (RT-PCR samples for Covid testing to be sent). If tested negative, they shall be allowed to go home after completion of 7 days of institutional quarantine and will be advised for home quarantine & self monitoring of their health status for another 7 days (a written undertaking in this regard shall be submitted to health officials/district administration).
- (iv) If tested positive they shall be shifted to Government isolation facility and treated as per health protocol (as mentioned in para 4).
- (v) All such passengers will download COVA app which should remain active.



- (vi) In case of exceptional circumstances such as pregnancy/ death of immediate family member/ Severe Mental Illness, Concerned Deputy Commissioner may allow for 14 days of home quarantine instead of institutional quarantine and this must be intimated to Health Department.

2. Guidelines for domestic travel (air/train/inter-state travel by road):

- (i) All persons arriving through air, rail, road will be screened at the entry points for symptoms of Covid-19.
- (ii) The passengers found to be symptomatic during screening shall be taken to health facility for testing. If tested positive would be treated as per health protocol (as mentioned in para 4 below).
- (iii) If asymptomatic or tested negative (para-ii above), they will be allowed to go home after submitting an undertaking for home quarantine for 14 days & self monitoring of their health status and must report to nearest health facility in case of development of any symptoms of Covid-19.
- (iv) All such passengers will download COVA app which should remain active.

3. Guidelines for frequent interstate travelers:


- (i) Frequent interstate travelers who need to move outside Punjab, such as MP/MLA, salespersons, transporters, doctors, journalists, executives, engineers, traders, consultants etc. need not be home quarantined.
- (ii) Deputy Commissioners and Sub-Divisional Magistrates will issue passes to such persons who shall submit an undertaking for self monitoring of their health status and will inform the administration in case they experience any symptoms of Covid-19.
- (iii) All such persons must download COVA app which should remain active

4. Health Protocol :

- (i) RT-PCR samples as per ICMR criteria of all suspected cases will be taken for Covid testing.
- (ii) Those who test positive & asymptomatic, provided they are less than 60 yrs of age or do not have any comorbidity will be kept in Covid-Care Centers.



- (iii) Those who test positive and need medical supervision (either due to the severity of symptoms or any associated co-morbidity or of above 60 yrs of age) will be shifted to Level II or level III facility depending on their medical condition.
- (iv) All such persons may be discharged as per revised discharge policy of GOI.
5. However, for surveillance purpose, Government may test more persons as exception to these guidelines.
